#### The Rubin Family Bio

Rabbi Aron Rubin grew up in Melbourne, Australia, the land of koalas and reverse gravity. He studied for two years at Yeshivat Har Etzion in Alon Shevut, and attended college in Melbourne, where he earned a bachelor's degree in food science and chemical engineering. While at college, Rabbi Rubin was active in the Melbourne Jewish community, giving Torah classes, and as a counselor in Bnei Akiva. Upon graduating, he decided to follow his passions to become a Rabbi.

After completing college, Rabbi Rubin relocated to New York, where he earned his Semicha (Rabbinic Ordination) from Yeshiva University (and where he met his wife, Leia). He also participated in the combined RIETS/Ferkauf program, designed to further train Rabbis in the area of mental health and counseling. While studying for Semicha, Rabbi Rubin served as a Rabbinic Intern at the Roslyn Synagogue, and at the Great Neck Synagogue, in the New York Area. He also earned a masters degree in Jewish education from Yeshiva University's Azrieli School.

In 2019, Rabbi Rubin and his family moved to Overland Park, Kansas, where he is the Assistant Rabbi at Congregation BIAV, and serves a number of roles in the Kansas Jewish community. He was the Rabbi of the Kansas City Kollel, and taught across a number of ages at Hyman Brand Hebrew Academy. He is currently the Rabbinic Representative at the Vaad HaKashruth of Kansas City, and performs a number of roles for the Vaad.

When not learning or teaching, Rabbi Rubin can be found baking a cake, reading, nurturing one of his indoor plants, or taking care of household responsibilities.

Leia Rubin (Wachsstock) hails all the way from a place called "St. Louis, Missouri". She attended Block Yeshiva High School, and spent one and a half years at Michlalah Seminary in Jerusalem. Leia has a B.A. in Judaic studies from Touro College, and a master's degree in occupational therapy from Touro University. She currently works as an occupational therapist with hospital patients in acute care, and essentially doubles up as a professional weight-lifter (lifting patients for treatment).

Leia is very passionate about teaching Torah and communal involvement. In addition to her work and family responsibilities, Leia is very active in the Overland Park Jewish community. She is involved in youth and women's programming, studies with girls for their Bat Mitzvah, and teaches Torah classes to groups of women.

Rabbi Aron and Leia Rubin have three children: Eitan (6 years old), Yedidya (2 years old), and

Atara (2 months old).

#### **A Lesson from the 10 Commandments**

The Ten Commandments were addressed in singular to the whole of the Jewish people; if even one Jew was missing, the Torah could not have been given. You are essential... and you have a unique role and mission.

#### YISRO: The Sanctity of Time (



In the Torah reading of Yitro, Yitro gives us a new perspective on time management. He observes his son-in-law Moses standing all day to arbitrate disputes. Yitro places a supreme value on Moses's time, so he steps outside the acknowledged conventions and creates a unique solution. He suggests to Moses that judges be appointed to handle the huge backlog of cases.

Thus begins the all-important survival technique of delegation.

There are many things we can learn from Yitro, an inspiring and intelligent individual who chooses to convert to Judaism. But one important takeaway message from this Torah portion is to value our time and the time of others.

G-d put us on earth for a reason. We each have a purpose to fulfill. We each have mitzvahs to do, people to help, sparks of holiness to elevate. Our time is a precious resource and, unlike money, once we've wasted it we can never make it back.

"Let's meet for coffee at 10:00 AM," I suggested to a friend. But how was I to know Sarah would call to complain about her mischievous son, and Avi would drop in to deliver a thank-you bottle of wine for last Shabbat? Could I have possibly foreseen the rabbi asking if a committee meeting could be rescheduled, or Marty arriving to clean the rain gutters? Panting dramatically (I'd run only from a nearby parking space), I apologized for my tardiness as I glanced guiltily at my cell: "10:12? I cannot believe it!" And I launched into my litany of excuses, which actually served no purpose but delaying our scheduled exchange even longer. Perhaps I can take a lesson from Yitro, and search for creative ways to manage my time.

Valuing time means that we use it wisely. If I stay in the kitchen when the kids are visiting, or talk on the phone when my husband and I are finally the only ones home in the evening, am I shortchanging those relationships? Being present with our loved ones shows that we value them and their time.

Imagine the accomplishment of being present wherever you are, giving one hundred percent to your loved ones, your prayer, your study, your work and your colleagues. Focusing on the activity directly ahead of you without allowing your attention to stray will be a colossal achievement. It will undoubtedly take determination and much practice.

But it will be worth it.




