9 Days & Tisha B'Av

Rosh Chodesh Av occurs on Shabbos, July 26. This begins a period of time known as the '9 Days.' The first nine days of the month of Av, and also the morning of the tenth, are days of acute mourning for the destruction of the first and second Holy Temples. In addition to the restrictions that apply to the entire three-week period, during this time we refrain from the following additional joyous activities:

- Eating meat and drinking wine (except for Shabbos)
- Laundering clothing,
- Swimming or bathing for pleasure
- Remodeling or expanding a home.
- Hair cut or Shaving

On Tisha B'Av:

- We don't sit on a chair (like mourners during Shiva) until Chatzos (1:07 PM) on Tisha B'Av day
- No showering or washing for pleasure, if one gets dirty they can do minimal cleaning
- We do not wear leather shoes, it can be comfortable shoes just make sure there is no leather
- No eating or drinking until the fast concludes
- Physical Intimacy is prohibited on Tisha B'Av
- Spreading of lotion, creams, and use of perfumes are prohibited unless medicinal

If someone is unsure about their ability to fast please reach out to Rabbi David #314-920-9270 Prohibitions of the 9 days should be observed until Monday at Chatzos (1:07 PM)

The Leader-as-Teacher

"In Devarim, Moses gave the people their Why. They are G-d's people, the nation on whom He has set his love, the people He rescued from slavery and gave, in the form of the commandments, the constitution of liberty. They may be small but they are unique. They are the people who, in themselves, testify to something beyond themselves. They are the people whose fate will defy the normal laws of history. Other nations, says Moses, will recognise the miraculous nature of the Jewish story - and so, from Blaise Pascal to Nikolai Berdyaev and beyond, they did. In the last month of his life Moses ceased to be the liberator, the miracleworker and redeemer, and became instead Moshe Rabbeinu, "Moses, our teacher." He was the first instance in history of a leadership type in which Jews have excelled: the leaderas-teacher. " - Rabbi Lord Jonathan Sacks, ZT"L

SHABBOS CHAZON: Rebuke to Reward

This Shabbat is called Shabbat Chazon (Shabbat of Vision), named for the haftorah, the vision of Isaiah.

The Torah reading starts with a rebuke of the Jewish people, Moses lectures them on many of their failings. It ends, however, on a positive note. Moses tells them that when they enter the Promised Land and go up against Canaanites, they should not fear, because G-d will fight for them.

So, too, in the *haftorah*, Isaiah starts his vision with a rebuke, only to turn around and end on a positive note "Zion will be redeemed through justice ... "

These readings are always read on the Shabbat before 9 Av, the saddest day on the Jewish calendar, commemorating the destruction of our Holy Temples in Jerusalem and much more.

The rebukes in our parshah and *haftorah* seem to fit the theme of 9 Av, but how does the positive ending fit?

Perhaps they are there to teach us that although 9 Av is a sad day, all that sadness has a positive purpose. None of the suffering was in vain. We will one day see with clarity how our efforts and suffering brought about the ultimate redemption.

This helps answer a second question.

When Moshiach comes, 9 Av will be celebrated as a happy day. Why? True, all sadness will end, but its history remains a sad one. So why celebrate? We will be joyous because we will see the positive outcome of all the events that now appear so negative.

Each of us finds ourselves in difficult situations from time to time. It's hard to see the positive in it. But if you stop and recognize that G-d placed you in that specific situation, you will realize that there must be a positive purpose. Though you might not be aware of what the purpose is, you will still be able to keep upbeat and positive. - Rabbi Yitzi Hurwitz. WWW.CHABAD.ORG

Tisha B'Av, the 9th day of the month of Av, is the saddest day on the Jewish calendar, on which we fast, deprive ourselves, and pray. It is the culmination of the Three Weeks marking the destruction of the 1st and 2nd Holy Temples in Jerusalem, the expulsion of Jews from Spain in 1492, the start of WWI, the deportation of the Warsaw ghetto in 1942, and other national calamities that occurred at this time throughout history.


