



What is Kol Nidre?

Kol Nidre ("all vows") is an ancient formula, said on Yom Kippur eve, declaring all unintentional vows we may make over the (coming) year null and void. It has also come to refer to the entire Yom Kippur evening service.

Kol Nidre is chanted by the leader of the congregation (chazan), flanked by men bearing at least 3 Torah scrolls. Kol Nidre is said three times consecutively, with the congregation standing and chanting the words along in an undertone. It concludes with the leader and the congregation chanting a number of verses in the Torah that mention G-d's forgiveness.

Kol Nidre serves a technical function, ensuring that we do not unknowingly transgress vows we may not even know we've made. This is similar to the declaration made on the morning before Rosh Hashanah.

On a deeper level, it reflects the way we enter this sacred day, when we are wholly united with G-d and each other, leaving behind our self-imposed limitations, proclaiming—to ourselves and G-d—that we regret and distance ourselves from the poor decisions that we humans inevitably make.

Immediately following Kol Nidre, the chazan loudly chants the Shehecheyanu blessing, in which we thank G-d for bringing us to this sacred day. - excerpted from *Rabbi Menachem Posner*, www.chabad.org

MOSES' LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT

At the end of parashah Haazinu Moses reviews his last will and testament for the Jewish people:

Vayomer aleihem ... - And he [Moses] said to them, "Apply your hearts to all the words that I testify against you today, with which you are to instruct your children, to be careful to perform all the words of this Torah, for it [the Torah] is not an empty thing for you, for it is your life, and through this matter you shall prolong your days" (Deuteronomy 32:46-47)


Moses' message is a threefold teaching that should guide us throughout life. If Torah is to be our life, it cannot be just a cerebral learning experience but must saturate our entire being and guide all our thoughts and deeds. The Torah education of our children must be our top priority. We must bear in mind that the Torah is not empty. Every word, every letter, is laden with wisdom and hidden treasures that will prolong our days and give meaning to our lives. – excerpted from *Rebbetzin Esther Jungreis*, www.aish.com
